
Lunchtime Assistant

Playing a key role in the lives of young people, Lunchtime Assistants supervise pupils throughout the lunchtime period in the dining room and in the playground. As a Lunchtime Assistant you will be **part of a student centered approach to teaching and learning that is underpinned by the Island's** Essentials for Learning Curriculum statement, the aim of which is **'to inspire learners to flourish in life'**. The outcomes of which will be helping young people be healthy, stay safe, enjoy and achieve, positively contribute and prosper.



Responsibilities

- Take responsibility of dealing with incidents, providing first aid attention when required
- Co-operate with teaching staff
- Direct pupils to free tables and ensure tables are cleaned
- Encourage high standards of behaviour
- Point of contact between pupils and teaching staff
- Promote positive play in the playground such as skipping
- Encourage pupils to eat, assist where required
- Maintain positive working relationships with colleagues

Qualifications, Experience and Skills

- There are no formal qualifications or experience required to be a Lunchtime Assistant
- Good interpersonal and communication skills, the ability to promote play with children and a willingness to work as part of great teams are essential for this role
